**Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup Week**

July 19th through July 25th 2010

**Whereas**, our community's numerous waterways provide important health, safety, scenic, and economic benefits to residents and visitors alike; and

**Whereas**, for the past 36 years, the Marine Industries Association of the Treasure Coast has been dedicated to protecting our waterways by promoting the values of the industry while educating elected officials and the public about their importance to our area; and

**Whereas**, thanks to the sponsorship from the Florida Inland Navigation District, the Marine Industries Association of the Treasure Coast is able to conduct the 3rd Annual Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup on Saturday, July 24, 2010 when over a thousand volunteers will participate in cleaning up the waterways of Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River counties; and

**Whereas**, in 2009, the cleanup produced 13 tons of trash from approximately 125 miles of waterways with the expectation of a significantly larger collection this year due to an increased number of volunteers who will have access to 22 designated registration and disposal sites; and

**Whereas**, the Indian River County Board of County Commissioners recognizes that the participation of residents, homeowners' associations, government entities and businesses are essential in providing long-term sustainability of our water resources.

**Now, therefore, be it Proclaimed by the Indian River County Board of County Commissioners** that the week of July 19th through July 25th, 2010, be honored as the Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup Week and furthermore, the board encourages all citizens to recognize and participate in this outstanding and valuable public campaign to improve the quality of our waterway.

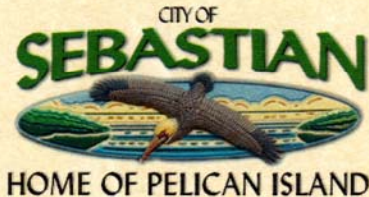

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of St. Lucie County, Florida, has made the following determinations:

1. On Saturday, July 24, 2010, the Marine Industries Association of the Treasure Coast, in conjunction with the Florida Inland Navigation District will conduct the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup.
2. The event is expected to attract more than 1,000 volunteers who will participate in cleaning up the waterways of Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River Counties.
3. There are twenty-two designated sites throughout the three counties that serve as registration and disposal sites for the project.
4. Numerous waterfront homeowner associations are being recruited to clean up their own waterfront.


**Declaring Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup Day in Martin County, Florida**

- Whereas,** in 2009, the clean-up effort collected over 13 tons of trash from approximately 125 miles of waterways




