^{*}New this year, we are reporting volunteer hours. Since so many participants and groups went out on multiple days & times, we feel this represents a true picture of our overall effort.

<u>Summary:</u> The 13th Annual Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup met the challenge of social distancing for the Covid-19 pandemic by transitioning into a week-long virtual cleanup. We anticipated a decrease in participation & trash collected, especially without our traditional sites. However, we were optimistic about the opportunities the extended cleanup times and digital data input could prove useful for future cleanups.

Results from the cleanup show a 44% decrease in participation and trash collection decrease of 33%. Organizers are impressed by the number of participants who volunteered on multiple days. The amount of trash is also impressive since participants were asked to limit trash pick up to what each could personally dispose. Significantly less construction materials were brought back. There was an overall increase in picnic trash and for the first time, mask and gloves became a regularly reported item.
