

Keep Indian River Beautiful, Inc. "KIRB" was proud to organize again this year's Ocean Conservancy 28th Annual International Coastal Cleanup Event. This cleanup was a huge success. We had approximately 1000 volunteers and 25 different sites being cleaned up last Saturday the 21st. The different groups cleaned Indian River Counties; beaches, waterways, spoil islands, and lagoon shores. Several different groups participated in the extravagant event and we would like to thank them along with our County Commissioners. KIRB provided to the volunteer's T-Shirt, water, garbage bags, recycle bags, first aid kits, gloves, sunblock, and instructions for events.
