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Southern Eagle Distributing hits the beach for trash

Ft. Pierce, FL – (June 13, 2015) — On Saturday, June 13th, Southern Eagle Distributing's employees and their families invaded the Ft. Pierce Beach near Jaycee Park to clean up the littered area. Their team of 61 strong collected more than 1,500 of pounds of trash.

The day was not all work, there was plenty of play. Everyone enjoyed a good time at the beach, with the band Burnt Biscuit to entertain. The kids enjoyed a bounce house, water slide, beach balls, squirt guns, hula hoops, face painting and more. Everyone enjoyed lots of food and a variety of beverages. Throughout the day more than 300 employees with their families joined in on the fun.

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The results from this cleanup will be calculated into the overall effort of the Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup, which will take place on July 25th. "It's a bonus that our efforts help to "kick off" this year's cleanup," says Busch. "This is an event that Southern Eagle has supported every year since its beginning in 2007.
