DESIGNATING JULY 20 2009 THROUGH JULY 25, 2009 AS TREASURE COAST WATERWAY CLEANUP WEEK IN INDIAN RIVER COUNTY

WHEREAS, on Saturday, July 25, 2009, the Marine Industries Association of the Treasure Coast in conjunction with the Florida Inland Navigation District will conduct the 2nd Annual Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup; and

WHEREAS, this event will attract approximately 1,000 volunteers who will participate in cleaning up the waterways of Indian River, Martin and St. Lucie Counties; and

WHEREAS, 22 designated sites throughout the three counties will serve as registration and disposal sites for the volunteers to work out of; and

WHEREAS, numerous waterfront homeowners associations have been recruited to cleanup their own waterfronts; and


WHEREAS, in 2008, nearly seven tons of trash was collected from approximately 125 miles of waterways with an expectation of a significantly larger amount to be collected this year with an increased volunteer effort.







WHEREAS, on Saturday, July 25, 2009, the Marine Industries Association of the Treasure Coast in conjunction with the Florida Inland Navigation District will conduct the 2nd Annual Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup; and

A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING THE WEEK OF
JULY 20, 2009 AS "TREASURE COAST
WATERWAY CLEANUP WEEK" IN ST. LUCIE
COUNTY, FLORIDA

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of St. Lucie County, Florida, has made the following determinations:

1. On July 25, 2009, the Marine Industries Association of the Treasure Coast, in conjunction with the Florida Inland Navigation District conducted the 2nd Annual Treasure Coast Waterway Cleanup.
2. The event attracted approximately 1,000 volunteers who participated in cleaning up the waterways of Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River Counties.
3. There were twenty-two designated sites throughout the three counties that served as registration and disposal sites for the project.
4. Numerous waterfront homeowner associations were recruited to clean up their own waterfront.
5. Early estimates indicate over ten tons of trash were collected from approximately 125 miles of waterways.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Lucie County, Florida:



PROCLAMATION SATURDAY JULY 25, 2009 TREASURE COAST WATERWAY CLEANUP DAY


